AREA ASSEMBLY VACANCIES AVAILABLE

<u>.Office Coordinator, AA East Rand:</u> The purpose of this role is to provide feedback to people who need information about AA and Area events/activities, ensure literature is available, liaise with other Areas and GSO and to facilitate good communication between the area portfolios. The coordinator must be knowledgeable about the service structure of AA as well as demonstrate knowledge of the AA Traditions.

This salaried position is half-day (5 hours per day, Monday to Friday), plus one meeting per month on a Saturday (2nd Saturday of each month, 2 – 3:30 pm)

<u>Alternate Delegate:</u> The alternate serves as a valuable assistant, often traveling with the delegate or giving reports for them. (Requirement of Minimum 5/6 years sobriety)

. Regional Trustee: These trustees are selected for their service experience and familiarity with A.A. principles. While no trustee can be said to "represent" a geographical section—all trustees represent only the Fellowship as a whole—regional trustees bring to the board's discussions a regional A.A. point of view and experience that is invaluable. (Requirement of Minimum 10 years sobriety)

<u>. Correctional Facilities:</u> The purpose of this portfolio is to assist the carrying of the message of recovery to the suffering alcoholic in Treatment and Correctional Facilities. The incumbent serves a three-year term (Requirement of Minimum of 3 years sobriety)

<u>. Archives:</u> Archives positions are engaged in the work of setting up an area archives to collect and preserve area history. Written materials (books, pamphlets, newsletters, written histories), photographs and audiotapes are the foundations of a collection. (Sobriety requirement subject to Area Office & Chair Person)

EDITORS NOTE FOR THE MONTH

Hi my fellow readers, this month I came across a speech of a AA member that was given by Judge John T. on the 4th Anniversary of the Chicago Group in 1943. It really inspired me and I wanted to share it with you. I trust you will draw some inspiration from it...

Why Were We Chosen

God in His wisdom selected this group of men and women to be purveyors of His goodness. In selecting them through whom to bring about this phenomenon He went not to the proud, the mighty, the famous or the brilliant. He went instead to the humble, to the sick, to the unfortunate. He went right to the drunkard, the so-called weakling of the world. Well might He have said the following words to us:"Unto your weak and feeble hands I have entrusted a power beyond estimate. To you has been given that which has been denied the most learned of your fellows. Not to scientists or statesmen, not to wives or mothers, not even to my priests or ministers have I given this gift of healing other alcoholics which I entrust to you."

"It must be used unselfishly; it carries with it grave responsibility. No day can be too long; no demands upon your time can be too urgent; no case can be too pitiful; no task too hard; no effort too great. It must be used with tolerance for I have restricted its application to no race, no creed, and no denomination. Personal criticism you must expect; lack of appreciation will be common; ridicule will be your lot; your motives will be misjudged. You must be prepared for adversity, for what men call adversity is the ladder you must use to ascend the rungs toward spiritual perfection, and remember, in the exercise of this power I shall not exact from you beyond your capabilities."

"You are not selected because of exceptional talents, and be careful always, if success attends your efforts not to ascribe to personal superiority that to which you can lay claim only by virtue of my gift. If I had wanted learned men to accomplish this mission, this power would have been entrusted to the physician and scientist. If I had wanted eloquent men, there would have been many anxious for the assignment, for talk is the easiest used of all talents with which I have endowed mankind. If I had wanted scholarly men, the world is filled with better qualified men than you who would be available. You were selected because you have been the outcasts of the world and your long experience as drunkards has

made or should make you humbly alert to the cries of distress that come from the lonely hearts of alcoholics everywhere."

"Keep ever in mind the admission you made on the day of your profession in AA -- namely that you are powerless and that it was only with your willingness to turn your life and will unto my keeping that relief came to you."

This piece shows that no matter what we may think of ourselves, we are a select few that have been chosen, with this beautiful gift of sobriety and the ability to take the healing that AA has offered us and to help the next suffering alcoholic. This shows me I was not just blessed for myself, but blessed to be a blessing to others, God took my mess of a life and turned it into a message of hope which I can share with others!
